

Hand Lettering: Christmas menu lantern

Step-by-step tutorial



1

Measure the height of your lantern glass and cut the doily to the required height using the cutter blade.

2

Draw light guide lines onto the doily using the geometry set square and pencil, to help you create straight and symmetrical lettering.



3

Use the black pigment liner (line width 0.5 mm) to create the lettering for the text of your Christmas menu on the doily.

4

Draw in Christmasy branches between your menu courses using the green and red pigment liners. Use the gold metallic marker to add highlights within and around the word, "Menu."



5

Carefully rub out the pencil guide lines. Caution: don't use the eraser on the areas where you've used the metallic marker.



6

Wrap the doily around the lantern and fasten at the back with masking tape.



7

Tie the eucalyptus spray around the bottom of the lantern and fasten it with cook's string.
