

## Travel Time - DIY postcards




### **A very special way to send greetings and good wishes**

## Step-by-step tutorial





Cut the watercolour paper to postcard size (10.5x14.8 cm) and stick masking tape or washi tape over the edges, creating a polaroid look.

I've covered 1 cm at the sides and 3 cm at the bottom here. Then colour in the upper edge of the paper in a red shade.

Blend the red colour downwards with a water brush so that you can't see the individual strokes any more.

To create an ombré effect, add a second colour, e.g. dark yellow, and go over it with water, too. After the card has dried, sketch in the shell design lightly with a pencil.

Go over the outlines of the shell with a brown brush pen and then paint over carefully with the water brush. After the design has dried, go over the whole thing once more with the thin end of a dark grey brush pen, to highlight the details.

A few paint splatters will create a lovely effect on your postcard. To achieve this, put some paint on a smooth (non-absorbent) surface such as cling film and pick it up using the water brush and some water. Then tap the brush with your index finger to create the splatters.

Now you can remove the masking tape and write a nice holiday greeting at the bottom of the card using pigment liners and brush pens.
